REFLECTIONS ON 2021

Here are some interesting statistics from 2021:

- We rewarded our staff, giving away over 130 gift vouchers
- On-time safety training improved by an average 47%
- Our breeders celebrated the highest settable egg production in a farm, with Mt Molar reaching an all-time record for Darwalla
- We hatched around 12.5% more chicks in 2021
- We welcomed 6 new broiler farms into the Darwalla fold, increasing our floor space by around 17%
- The Adare team set a new PIF record of 465.53
- The number of birds processed increased by 10%

MEET OUR GROWERS: STEVE—ADARE



Steve first grew for Darwalla at Brisbane Valley Protein's Springbank farm and after a year off, is now managing the new Pro Ten Adare complex. The first batch completed in December with a Darwalla record of PIF465.53. Steve is very proud of the result, noting that everything had to fall into place to achieve such a great result; good birds, environment, feed & care. The record result was achieved with the help of Vickie & Norm, who used to grow for Darwalla in the Northern Rivers.

How did you get into chicken farming? I came to Australia from the UK in 2014 with the intention to run a water plant in Blanchetown, South Australia, but ended up growing free range birds instead! I managed an Inghams farm for a few years, then moved north to QLD with Inghams initially, before moving to grow at Springbank and now Adare.

What did you do BC (before chickens)? Prior to moving to Australia, I was a plumbing & heating engineer in London, so it's

been a big learning curve to get into chickens. While living in London, I came to Australia to visit my sister on the Gold Coast & decided to migrate. I lived in London for 20 years but my son was young & I wanted to give him a better upbringing.

What do you like best about your job? I love being outside & not being stuck with the same job day after day. There's a variety—maintenance, animals, admin, people —and it's great when it all comes together at the end of the batch.

If you weren't a chicken farmer, you'd be...? I had my own company in London, so probably be project managing in construction.

What do you do when you're not working in the sheds? Sport! My son plays a lot of sport, so I'm always ferrying him around to his various events. We love camping & outdoors when we're not running around with sport. I used to enjoy mountain bike riding in the UK so would like to try that again.

What's your favourite chicken dish? I'm a traditional-ist—I love a roast, with roasted potatoes, brussell sprouts, Yorkshire pudding and gravy.


SUSTAINABILITY UPDATE

With the revised Training Portal and follow up's, we have taken our safety training completions on time from an average of 52% completions in 2019 to consistently over 99% each month – a big thankyou for everyone completing their training on time.

More importantly, the increased focus on the Top 5 Hazards at Darwalla has helped reduce our injury rate significantly in the last 6 months.
