STRATEGY MAP



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ORGANISATIONAL ANNOUNCEMENT

Darwalla has reached an agreement with ProTen to develop the Adare Broiler complex. Under the agreement Darwalla will sell the property with development approval to ProTen. Over the next year, Pro Ten will build two modern six shed broiler farms on the site. The farms will be contracted under a long-term agreement to grow livebirds for Darwalla.



ProTen is Australia's largest broiler growing company. They own and operate almost 500 sheds across Australia, representing around 17% of Australia's broiler production. The Adare Complex represents a significant boost to our growing capacity and a welcome addition to our growers' group.

This agreement marks a milestone in the Adare project which started over a decade ago and it has taken persistent effort to achieve this outcome. Special mention must be given to David Bray, our Development Manager, who has driven the project for the full course.

Earthworks at Adare are due to commence early in the New Year with sheds to be built by Santrev for placement mid-2021.

RSPCA & TUROSI AUDITS

Although RSPCA audits occur virtually year-round, the Turosi audit—like Christmas—comes around just once per year.

This year our Laidley rearing farm, the hatchery and Tim & Lee from the West Road broiler farm were scrutinized head to toe, with all being in order.
