

MEET OUR GROWERS: DAN, GERMAN CHURCH ROAD

Dan has been growing chickens for Darwalla for just over 10 years. He runs 12 sheds at our German Church free range farm, surrounded by the bush in a quiet corner of the Redlands. A real handyman, Dan loves tinkering in his shed, accompanied by his trusty sausage dog Fritz & Jessie the border collie.

How did you get into chicken farming? My Dad was a chicken farmer in South Australia, so I grew up around chooks. I was cleaning sheds out for my Dad when I was 12 years old. Dad would pay me \$25 per shed and it took me all weekend! Dad also ran a chicken catching business, and as I was working hard in the sheds I would see the manager standing at the end of the shed & thought to myself 'I'd love to be a chicken farm manager'.

What did you do BC (before chickens)? I've had a variety of jobs. I've worked in a piggery & was an oil salesman for Castrol oil around the vineyards in the Barossa Valley. I was also working on an oyster farm in Coffin Bay, which after chicken farming, would be my second favourite job. As a kid, as well as working on the farm, my Dad had race horses, so I'd be the strapper during the day & catching chickens at night. I was the strapper when we won the Country Cup in Gawler by 8 lengths, which was a real highlight.

What do you like best about your job? I really enjoy growing chickens. It's stressful but they grow fast & it's rewarding to see when a good batch comes together. It's tough when something goes wrong and we lose birds, though things are a lot better these days.

If you weren't a chicken farmer, you'd be...? Probably an oyster farmer. I worked on a farm in Coffin Bay, South Australia & loved eating them straight from the ocean. It's great to be out on the water surrounded by nature. Like chickens, there's also challenges with diseases farming oysters, at one time we lost our entire hatchery in South Australia due to disease.



What do you do when you're not working in the sheds? I enjoy woodworking & wood turning. I love to get away 4WD-ing & camping anywhere in nature where it's quiet. I recently drove up to Bowen & looped back down to Brisbane in my camper 4WD. It's great to get away from the farm to clear the head.

What's your favourite chicken dish? I eat chicken all the time but I'm not much of a cook. I love a roast chook & I've recently bought an air fryer, which does a great job & the chicken tastes even better done in the air fryer.
