APPRECIATION—CRAIG HOLLIBONE



Craig is our maintenance planner, based at the feed mill but working across Darwalla to help keep our equipment operating.

Tell me about your history with Darwalla? I started with Darwalla in Oct 2019 and went straight into a Cert IV in Leadership and Competitive Systems, which was a great way to meet people from other parts of Darwalla.

What did you do prior to Darwalla? I did my apprenticeship with Evans Deakin as a fitter & turner on ships in a dry-dock on the Brisbane river. From there, I moved to Bradken where I worked my way up from maintenance fitter to leading hand and supervisor, before they closed down in 1999. After that, I worked as a maintenance manager at Bradken's steel foundry at Runcorn before it also closed down.

What's a normal day look like? I maintain the MEX system, our maintenance system. This helps us keep on top of preventative maintenance and orders required for future jobs. This takes me across the whole of Darwalla. MEX is also used for the purchase of repair & maintenance equipment, so I spend some time getting quotes & putting together paperwork relating to keeping our equipment maintained. I also look after our contractor management, so making sure our contractors are properly inducted and insured before they start work with us. There's a big variety in my role and I enjoy working with the different people and work areas, helping people to problem-solve to get the fix or equipment they need.

What achievements are you most proud of? I enjoy seeing projects through to the end; to start with some ideas or a rough plan, to design, plan & implement the works and then see the finished job. One of these was the vegetable oil tank project at the feed mill. This was a new project for us and there was a lot of learning along the way which required collaboration and input from the various stakeholders.

What to do you enjoy doing outside of work? I enjoy working in our garden—wife Cathy and I have a great vegetable garden with corn, peas, lettuce, beans, sweet peas...I need a bigger yard! We have 5 grandkids who keep me busy and young.

Who is someone you appreciate in Darwalla? I appreciate Sam McLary, he's easy to get along with & is a big help to me & Darwalla with projects & maintenance at our farms located out west. Sam's got a great mindset & speaks honestly which makes communication easier.
